Sacred Shabbat Shuva Serenity

Shabbat Shuvah is the holiest day of the spiritually saturated week of *Aseret Yemai Teshuvah*. The Arizal taught that its energy is **linked to all the Shabbatot** of the past year, allowing it to serve as *Teshuvah* as we overcome any shortcomings in observance during the past year by regretting omissions and resolving to more meticulously guard *our Shabbat* in future. This is a great way to prepare for Yom Kippur! All safety protocols will be carefully followed and everyone is invited to participate.

Shabbat Shuva Soulful Sermonics

On *Shabbat Shuvah* preceding the holiest day of the year there's a time-honoured tradition for the community to gather for insightful, uplifting words of the Torah from it's spiritual leader. The content typically focuses on *Teshuvah* and related Yom Kippur themes.

Everyone's invited to join on Shabbat afternoon, for an hour prior to Mincha for a fascinating presentation by our Rav, from 5:45pm. The topic will be about whether *Teshuvah* is counted as one of the 613 Mitzvot or not, and how that's practically instructive for us today!

Note: There will be security guards on hand with proper lists to help guide you to your pre-reserved location. At this critical time, **we cannot accommodate any walk-ins** as the services are **already filled to their maximum** limited COVID-19 capacities.

Sacred Study in Holy Hours

Yom Kippur is considered to be the holiest day of the year; inclusive of ALL 25 hours, from sunset till nightfall. During these holy hours we should endeavour to fill the time with spiritual activities. With shorter services we will use time wisely!

In the afternoon hours, between the services our Rav, *bezrat Hashem*, will teach Torah, including the daily Chumash and Sefer Hamitzvot.

CLIMAX by ZOOM!

The traditional sounding of the Shofar **does not** comprise the fulfilment of an actual Mitzvah and is largely **symbolic**.

As such, and in view of the extraordinary situation, our Rav has decided to allow our membership to participate remotely via Zoom. Shul members will receive a special secure link just before Yomtov!
