

8:30 AM – **Parsha Prism ~ G-d, by any other Name**: Discover a unique name of G-d that was introduced by Chana. It's sometimes used to identify the Jewish People – and what it can teach us!

9:15 AM – **Shacharit Services** joyous, melodious & participatory.

9:30 AM – **The Youth Minyan**: Parent (and/or Grandparent) involvement welcome; kid-centric services motivate the children to happily enjoy and appreciate Davening and are rewarded for it!

10:15 AM – **Torah Reading**: More Plagues: Locust, Darkness, & Firstborns Death. Our first Mitzvah: Sanctify Time! Then slaughter a lamb, put blood on doorposts and G-d will pass-over the homes when smiting Firstborns. Eat the lamb; roasted with Matzah and Marror. Leaving so hastily; dough doesn't rise, with great riches – fulfilling the promise made to Avraham. Consecrate all Firstborns, observe Pesach annually by removing Chametz, eating Matzah, and telling the Story. Tefillin remind us of Exodus and bond to G-d.

10:30 AM – **Youth Programming**: In age-appropriate groups, it's just kids and counselors, *here it's minus* the parental participation.

11:00 AM – **Bat Mitzvah Plus** for Tweens - dynamically led by **Draiza**. The circle of girls participating each Shabbat is growing!

12:00 PM – **Musaf Service** begins, the children lead everyone in a melodious and happy chorus conclusion, singing *Ein KeloKainu*

12:30 PM – Our congregational **Kiddush** provides opportunity to socialize, share camaraderie and enjoy delicious refreshments.
