Uplifting Yahrtzeit-Hilula Observances

Light it Up | Give it Up | Print it Up | Study it Up

Among the cherished customs observed on a Yahrtzeit-Hilula are kindling a Yahrtzeit candle (preferably of beeswax), increasing one's giving of Tzedakah, and studying Mishnah in honour of the Tzaddik.

A particularly meaningful practice is to study chapters of Mishnah corresponding to the Hebrew letters of the Rebbe's name. Chassidim have long embraced this custom as a way of strengthening their spiritual connection and drawing inspiration from His holy Neshama. In addition, many make a special effort on this day to increase in Torah study, prayer, and acts of kindness, thereby channeling the unique spiritual energy associated with the Hilula into practical action.
